3.	State Affairs Update	<ul> <li>N. Livanos provided the State Affairs Update.</li> <li>NLC: <ul> <li>AK: the NLC bill will pick up where it left off in 2022. A survey of nurses is being conducted.</li> <li>DC: 7 of 13 council members support the NLC bill. There is opposition from the nursing union and concerns about financial impact. Staff anticipate a hearing this fall.</li> <li>HI: The workgroup just concluded. P. Zickafoose (DE) and S. Richardson (TN) discussed their compact experiences with the workgroup. 4.	Use of Nursys Quick Confirm by Party States	P. Zickafoose presented information about Nursys Quick Confirm, eNotify
		SD: the state is beginning to hold coalition meetings. The state's nurse practitioner (NP) association launched a survey and received no negative feedback regarding the compact. NCSBN hired a lobbyist and there is strong support within the NP association.
		MD: the state is beginning to hold coalition meetings, and created a partnership with a strategic firm. The state's hospital association agreed to make the compact more of a priority. The bill has passed in one chamber.
		<ul> <li>APRN Compact:</li> <li>AZ: the state is beginning to hold coalition meetings. Staff have a survey disseminated currently.</li> </ul>
		NY: NCSBN will hold an issue briefing to answer legislator questions. Staff is partnering with ANA's NY chapter.
		MN: NCSBN was included in a discussion regarding workplace issues. Staff are working to have NLC highlighted by stakeholders and committees.
		MA: An NLC bill will be heard in the healthcare financing committee next week. This is the first NLC hearing of the current two-year session and NCSBN staff will testify. A NCSBN survey of nurses was disseminated.

6.	60-Day Communication Kit	J. Puente discussed various resources that will be sent to members today to create awareness of the new 60-day residency rule with nursing stakeholders.	
7.	Member Updates	A. Bradywood announced Washington State Board of Nursing (BON) plans to begin issuing multistate licenses to Washington nurses as of Jan. 2024. The BON will send specific communications to all states upon receiving an estimate of a launch date.	
8.	Open Discussion Forum	L Scheidt (MO) discussed how automated licensure systems may cause a multistate license to change to a single-state when a licensee changes their address online, and the need for states to integrate Nursys API.
