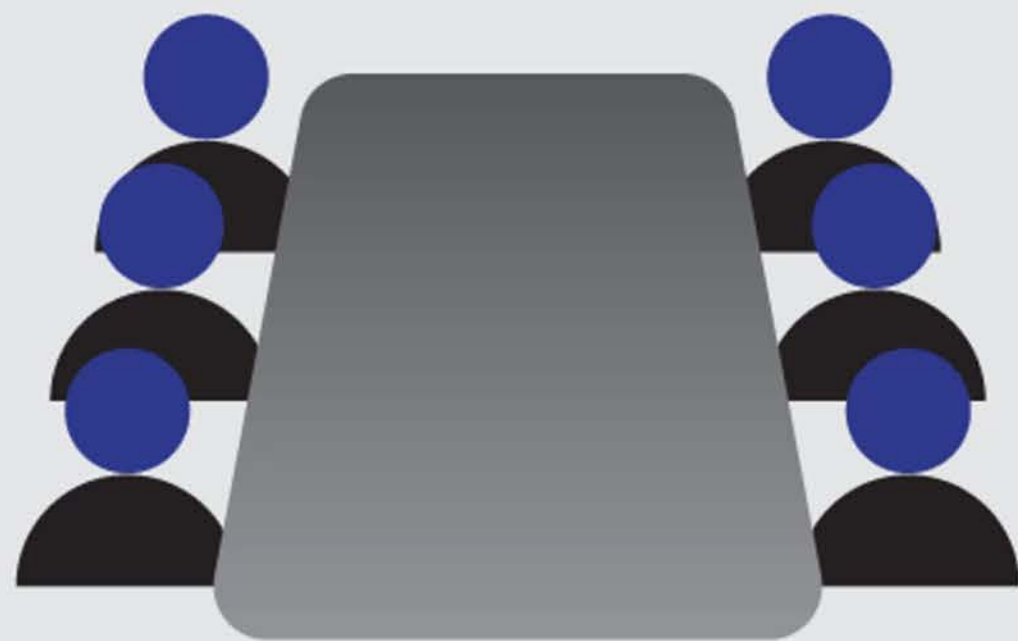

- Develop enhance governance and regulation



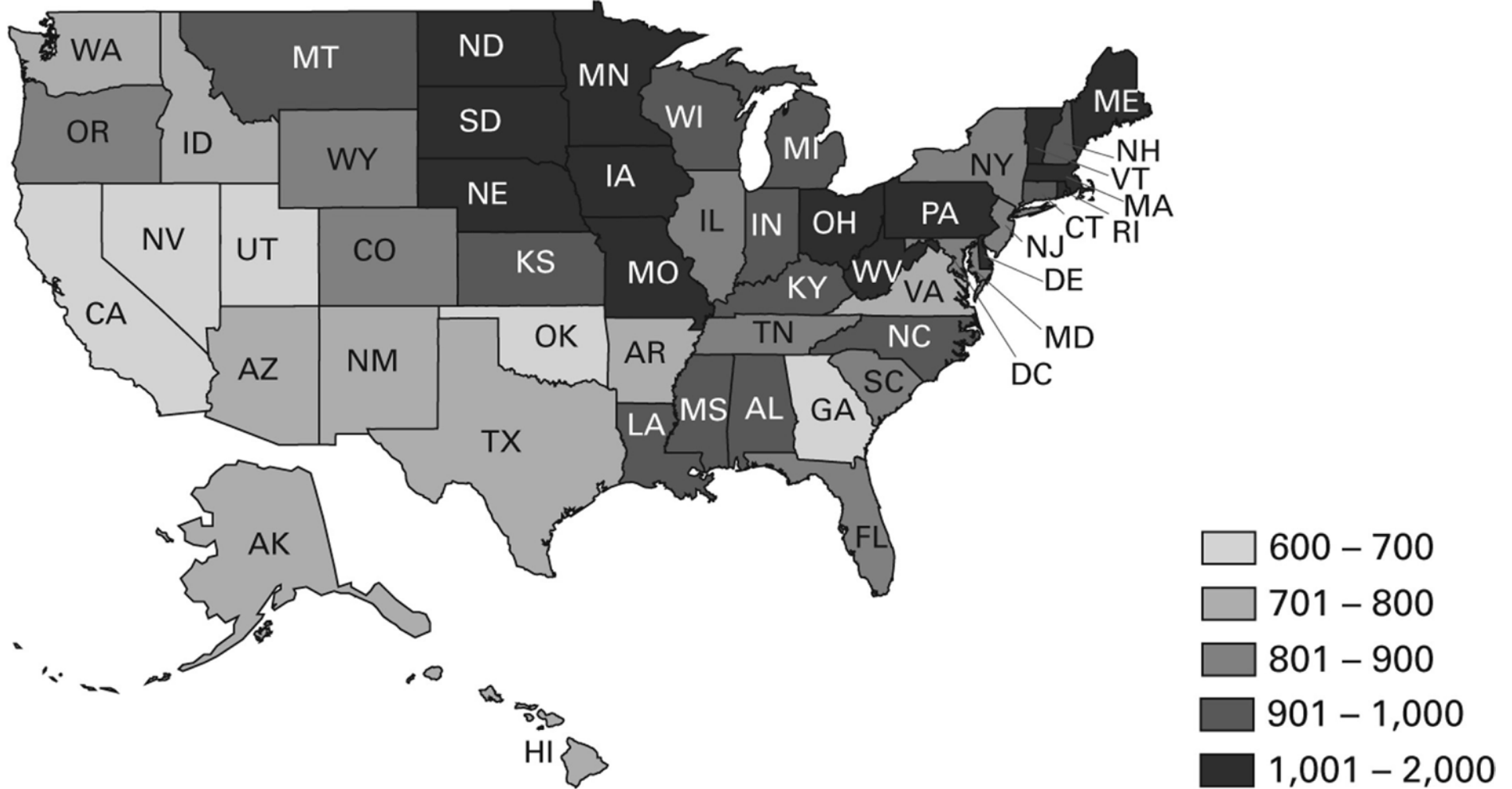
