REx-PN[®] Security Measures

Verifying Candidate Identity



Does the ID meet all acceptable ID requirements ?



Do the first and last names on the ID match exactly the first and last names that the candidate registered with?



Does the signature on the presented ID match the digital signature provided?



Does the recent photograph match the candidate presented?



Candidate Biometrics








NCSBN Examination Candidate Rules: Candidate Statement


Candidate Statement: By providing a digital signature, I give Pearson VUE my explicit consent to retain and transmit my personal data and test responses to Pearson VUE, my nursing regulatory body, and to NCSBN (any of which may be outside of the country in which I am testing). I also agree to the terms and conditions of the NCSBN Biometric Data Policy outlined on page 3 & 4. I understand the information provided and agree to follow the NCSBN Examination Candidate Rules. I agree to cooperate with the Test Administrator's investigation of any suspected irregular behavior, including the surrender of any suspected test preparation or study materials. Any incident of suspected irregular behavior, such as, but not limited to, falsifying my identification, tampering with the computer, engaging in disruptive behavior (including disclosure of examination content), will be reported to Pearson VUE, NCSBN, and my nursing regulatory body. In the event NCSBN and/or Pearson VUE determines that I have engaged in irregular behavior, my examination may be invalidated, and the nursing regulatory body may take other action and I will not be refunded my examination fee.

Test Environment

- Data Transmission and Software Security
- Video Cameras and Audio Recording
 - Video cameras and a microphone are in the testing room
 - A video monitor is at the proctor station
 - Digital tape is available for review in cases of unusual incidents





Case Documentation



Internet-based, real-time reporting and tracking system



Irregular behavior or activity documenting



Cases are accessed, viewed and updated by NCSBN®, nursing regulatory bodies and Pearson VUE

Result Holds


- Evidence of invalid results may include:
 - Observed irregular behavior or misconduct
 - An apparent discrepancy in or falsification of a candidate's identification
 - Failure to follow exam administration rules
 - Unusual response patterns

Testing Accommodations

What defines a testing accommodation?







- What constitutes a disability?
- Major life activities include, but are not limited to, the following:
 - Hearing
 - Walking
 - Working
 - Learning



REx-PN[®] Candidate

- Contacts NRB to determine accommodation requirements
- Requests accommodation to NRB and applies for licensure
- Registers for the REx-PN



Nursing Regulatory Bodies

- Review accommodations requests and supporting documentation
- Determine whether the accommodations are appropriate for the candidate's diagnosis
- Approve the appropriate accommodations





NCSBN®

- Reviews and determines whether accommodations requests:
 - are psychometrically sound
 - safeguard the fairness and security of the testing process for all candidates
- NCSBN will work with the NRBs to suggest alternatives and/or recommend the requests be denied to the candidate if necessary





Pearson VUE

- Candidates receive their ATT
- Candidates schedule their exam online or over the phone with the Pearson VUE Accommodations Coordinator
- Candidates take their exam with approved accommodations





Common Accommodation Requests

- Extra Time 3 hours
- Extra Time Double Time 2
 Days
- Separate Room & Reader
- Personal Items
