- [Announcer] 2020 Elaine Ellibee Award. A testament to Patricia Sharpnack's leadership skills is the fact that she was elected by her peers on the Ohio Board of Nursing for three terms. The governor also recognized her leadership as board president by calling upon her to participate on the governor's cabinet Opioid Action Team and collaborate with the governor's office, state agencies, and other regulatory boards to fight the opioid epidemic.

She was selected to present at Sigma's 30th International Nursing Research Congress in 2019, where she collaborated with nursing scholars from around the world involved in the advancement of Nursing Science. Her position as dean of the Ursuline College of Nursing has been invaluable in forging better communication and changing board policies dealing with various aspects of education when needed.

She has also advanced NCSBN strategic plan and initiatives. Some of her significant contributions in fulfilling those initiatives include creating a pathway for military and service members to become licensed LPNs, promoting relevant and responsive APR and regulation, and advocating for regulatory approaches that are responsive to changes in nursing practice and education.

Patricia's exceptional leadership, dedication, and commitment to regulatory excellence and public protection is why she was given the Elaine Ellibee Award in 2020.
