Founded March 15, 1978, as an independent not-for-profit organization, NCSBN was initially created to lessen the burdens of state governments and bring together nursing regulatory bodies (NRBs) to act and counsel together on matters of common interest. It has evolved into one of the leading voices of regulation across the world.

NCSBN's membership is comprised of the NRBs in the 50 states, the District of Columbia, and four U.S. territories — American Samoa, Guam, Northern Mariana Islands and the Virgin Islands. There are three exam user members. There are also 27 associate members that are either NRBs or empowered regulatory authorities from other countries or territories.



NCSBN Raises Passing Standard for NCLEX-PN® Examination

The NCSBN Board of Directors (BOD) voted on Dec. 9, 2019, to raise the passing standard for the NCLEX-PN® Examination. The new passing standard became -0.18 logits, 0.03 logits higher than the previous standard of -0.21 logits. The new passing standard took effect on April 1, 2020.

NCSBN Contributes Regulatory Perspective to <u>State</u> of the World's Nursing 2020: Investing in Education, <u>Jobs and Leadership Report</u>



While the focus of this report was not the global pandemic, its recommendations and insights spoke to the irrefutable fact that the importance of nurses in such crises is immeasurable. During this time of crisis, nurse regulators have played a central role in offering accurate data, evidence and suggestions for legislative change that are helping to care for those affected by the pandemic. Many of these changes provide solutions that should be sustained in the longer term. For years evidence has demonstrated that nurses need to be enabled to work to their full scope of practice. Regulators and the professional associations

have brought this evidence to the attention of government as a solution to increasing capacity and access to needed quality services during the COVID-19 outbreak.







Indiana Implements the Nurse Licensure Compact

Indiana joined 32 other states in implementing the <u>Nurse Licensure</u> <u>Compact</u> (NLC). The NLC allows registered nurses (RNs) and licensed practical/vocational nurses (LPN/VNs), whose primary state of residence is in an NLC state, to hold one multistate license, with the authority to practice in person or via telehealth, in both their home state and other NLC states.



Nursys®

Powered by U.S. nursing regulatory bodies (NRBs), Nursys® is the only national database for verification of nurse licensure, publicly available discipline and practice privileges for RNs, LPN/VNs and advanced practice registered nurses (APRNs) provided directly by participating NRBs and designated by them to be primary source equivalent. During fiscal year 2020 Nursys accomplished the following:

- Nursys e-Notify Database Reaches Milestone of One Millionth Nurse Enrolled
- Nursys e-Notify Database Enrolls more than 500,000 Individual Nurses
- Nursys e-Notify® Offers Free Fast-track Nurse
 License Verification for State and Federal Emergency

 need to do individual searches. An account is quick
 to set up and free to register. Emergency response
 organizations can enroll and review groups of licenses







NCSBN Leads the Way During the Pandemic

NCSBN both led and was an active participant in a number of initiatives designed to increase access to NCLEX examination administration, reduce regulatory barriers for providers, open clinical experiences for nursing students and offer direction on the administration of the COVID-19 vaccines. NCSBN along with other leading nursing organization, government entities and educational institutions:

- Advocated for the removal of unnecessary regulatory barriers for advanced practice registered nurses (APRNs) so that they can practice to the top of their skills, education and training.
- Provided guidance to states and state boards of nursing (BONs) in determining whether nurses who have encumbered licenses can return to the workforce via waiving of the disciplinary action during the COVID-19 pandemic.

More than 35,000 Health Care Professionals take NCSBN's COVID-19 courses

NCSBN's International Center for Regulatory Scholarship (ICRS) offered an invaluable series of <u>free online COVID-19</u> courses. Three of the four courses offer continuing education credit upon completion and more than 75,000 courses were taken by individuals enrolled.



NCSBN Offers Recommendations about COVID-19 Vaccine Administration

In order to best protect the public, <u>NCSBN's</u> policy states, "COVID-19 vaccines can be safely administered by RNs, LPNs/VNs APRNs, in addition to other licensed health care providers such as physicians, physician assistants and pharmacists."







NCSBN Champions Practice/Academic Partnerships

In the midst of NCSBN ensuring that candidates still had access to NCLEX® testing sites while following U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) guidelines, another obstacle emerged to ensuring that newly licensed nurses could enter the workforce. Hospitals and other health care facilities closed clinical experiences to nursing students. Without these vital clinical experiences nursing students are unable to meet their program requirements and are not eligible for graduation. Cognizant of this issue, NCSBN and the leaders of nine other nursing organizations issued a policy brief that called for practice/academic partnerships between health care facilities and prelicensure registered nursing (RN) and practical/vocational nursing (PN/VN) programs across the country during the COVID-19 crisis.

NCSBN and Pearson VUE Deliver a Valid and Secure Exam in a Safe Testing Environment

When the COVID-19 pandemic caused the shutdown of almost every public testing center across the U.S., NCSBN and Pearson VUE were aware of unprecedented need for nurses and their importance in the health care system during this time of global pandemic. They recognized they had a crucial role in assisting to put more nurses into the workforce and worked round-the-clock to reopen these testing centers. Adhering to U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) guidelines, they modified the length of the exam to allow the greatest number of candidates to test within social distancing requirements.

Throughout the peak testing season, efforts were underway to ensure that testing centers provided enough capacity to accommodate candidates. The modified exam had no negative impact on the candidates' testing experience or results. The psychometric integrity of the NCLEX exams was not compromised in any way and the difficulty levels and passing standards of the exams were not changed.
